
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## **Instructions:**

Shuffle cards and place in a bag or container so cards cannot be seen. The first player takes a card, saying the sound of the letter card they pull out. This player keeps taking cards until an egg card appears, then play moves to the next person. When all cards have been played, count your cards. The player with the most cards is the winner. \*Play by saying a sound that each letter makes (generally the most common ones for consonants, and the short sounds for vowels). Variations:

- Play by saying the letter names, so that children become aware of both the phonological sounds and the names.
- Arrange the cards in alphabetical order.
- Print 2 copies of pages 1-4 and use for games such as Memory,
  Snap or Go Fish.


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

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
